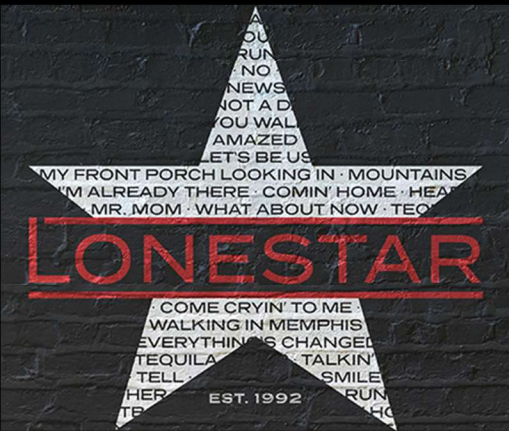

AR Enhanced Concealed Carry Course

Taught by certified concealed handgun safety instructor Buck Morris, this course offers a safe, friendly environment for Arkansas residents to qualify for an enhanced concealed carry license (E-CHCL). Classroom experience and firing qualification (to be held at a local range) meets the 2017 changes to A.C.A. §§ 5-73-101 to -324. The E-CHCL gives a licensee the ability to carry and possess a concealed handgun in more locations than the standard AR CHCL. The course training requirements are significantly more detailed and in-depth compared to the standard AR CHCL with more detailed classroom training in aspects of self-defense with a firearm, as well as a minimum accuracy on timed live-fire qualification requirements. Participants must be 21 years of age and a resident of the State of Arkansas. In addition, participants must already possess an Arkansas CHCL or must complete the basic Arkansas Concealed Carry class first.

Stop the Bleed

According to the National Trauma Institute, hemorrhaging is responsible for almost 35% of pre-hospital deaths and 40% of deaths in the first twenty-four hours after a traumatic event. Far too many deaths occur because of the inability to stop hemorrhaging and the time it takes to transport an injured person to a medical facility. Whether a professional rescuer or a layperson, this class will teach you how to administer simple medical care to victims that will stop hemorrhaging and increase the survival rate.

HeartSaver CPR

Hands-Only CPR can save lives. Anyone who experiences cardiac arrest at home, work, or in a public location dies because they do not receive immediate CPR from someone on the scene. As a bystander, do not be afraid. Your actions can only help. Hands-Only CPR performed by a bystander has shown to be as effective as CPR with breaths in the first few minutes of an out-of-hospital sudden cardiac arrest for an adult victim. Hands-Only CPR is CPR without mouth-to-mouth breaths. People who see an adult collapse in an "out-of-hospital" setting recommend it for use.

3. For servicing or disposing of low-pressure appliances (Type III).
4. For servicing all types of equipment (Universal).

The **Mosaic Templars Cultural Center**

(MTCC) was founded as the Mosaic Templars of America Center for African American Culture and Business Enterprise under Act 1176 of 2001. MTCC was created as a museum of Arkansas Heritage to honor the story of the Mosaic Templars of America and all of Arkansas's African American history. In April of 2020, after a multi-year process, MTCC became the third Black history institution in the South to be accredited by the American Alliance of Museums. The museum is dedicated to telling the story of the African American experience in Arkansas. The new 35,000-square-foot interior is a state-of-the-art museum complex with exhibits, classroom, staff offices and an auditorium that seats 400 people. The façade of the new structure is a facsimile of the 1913 building complete with the Annex building facade, which burned in 1984.
